

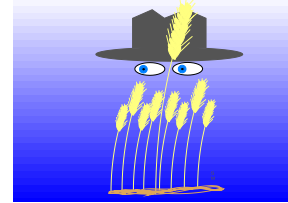

**Kansas City Board of Police Commissioners
Missouri Statewide Licensing of Private Investigators**

- HB780/SB308 - statewide licensing of private investigators effective 28 August 2007
- Codified as RSMo 324.1100 - 324.1148
- Establishes a Board of Private Investigator Examiners within the Division of Professional Registration
- Municipalities prohibited from regulating - RSMo 324.1114 para 3.
- Law Enforcement Officers may be licensed as private investigators - RSMo 324.1146

Looking Forward

- Division of Professional Registration estimates it will take 18 months to establish licensing under these provisions
- Coordination required for transfer of persons licensed by KC in private investigator classification - Division of Professional Registration needs listing
- Coordination requested by Division of Professional Registration in developing administrative rules & regulations
- Title 17 may need revision to remove or alter the private investigator classification; may be an issue of city licensing persons exempt under new statutes
- Police Board may need to establish rules for Kansas City officers wishing to license as private investigators
